The Bishop invites the Churchwardens quietly to read through the declaration which they are about to make.

After a moment's silence, the Churchwardens stand and make their declaration together:

(Bishop /Registrar)	Churchwardens are officers of the bishop, responsible for representing the laity, supporting and co-operating with their incumbent and caring for the church building and its contents.
	Will you, as leaders elected by your parish and as partners with your incumbent, promote God's mission through pastoral care, sharing the good news, serving the community and working for the unity of God's church?

(Bishop /Registrar)	Will you do your best to ensure that the church building and its contents are properly maintained, and that they offer a welcome and a witness to the love of God in Jesus Christ?
Wardens	We will, with the help of God
Bishop	
(Bishop /Registrar)	Will you care for your clergy and support them in their ministry, offering guidance and advice and ensuring that responsibilities are shared?
Wardens	We will, with the help of God

Bishop	I invite you now to make your declaration together.
Wardens	I solemnly and sincerely declare that I will faithfully and diligently perform the duties of the office of Churchwarden within the parish in which I am called to serve for the coming year.
Bishop	I admit as Churchwardens all you who have made this solemn declaration. May our Lord Jesus Christ be with you in all you do in his service, and give you grace to fulfil this office to the glory of God and for the good of his people. Amen

The newly admitted Churchwardens say together:

Wardens I will speak out for those who have no voice.

I will stand up for the rights of all the oppressed.

I will speak truth and justice.

I will defend the poor and needy.

I will speak out for those who have no choices.

I will cry out for those who live without love.

I will show God's compassion to the crushed and broken in spirit.

I will lift up the weak in Jesus' name. Amen. The clergy and others also stand:

All	With the help of God, we will.
Archdeacon	Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society by prayer for the world and its leaders, by defending the weak, and seeking peace and justice?
All	With the help of God, we will.
