How can I find a job?

Searching for a new job is hard work, and we're here to guide you every step of the way. The resources below will help you find the job that's right for you.



Certainly! <u>Crafting an effective CV is crucial when applying for jobs</u>. Let's break down the essential sections you should include in your CV:

Contact Details:

Start with your name (first name and surname only) as the title of your CV.

Include your professional job title alongside your name.

Provide your phone number, email address, and optionally a link to your professional network profile (e.g., LinkedIn).

Skip details like age, date of birth, marital status, or nationality.

Personal Profile:

A brief section that summarizes who you are, what you can bring to the role, and your career goals.

Make it concise and tailored to the job you're applying for.

Place it just below your contact information.

Education History:

If you're early in your career or lack extensive work experience, start with your education.

Include the names of your qualifications, the institutions where you studied, and the dates you attended.

Work History:

List your work placements, volunteering experiences, and paid jobs.

Begin with the most recent experience.

For each job, include:

Employer name

Job title

Dates of employment

A brief description of your responsibilities using the STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result).

Gaps in Work History:

It's normal to have gaps between jobs due to life event, but it is advisable to explain them – try and be as positive about this as possible.

Remember these additional tips:

Use a clear font (Arial, Times New Roman, or Calibri) in size 11 or larger.

Maintain consistent formatting throughout your CV.

Use headings and bullet points for readability.

Proofread your CV to ensure correct spelling and grammar.

Tailor your CV to match the job and company you're applying to improve your chances of getting an interview

Speak to an adviser if you need help with your CV

- 1. Carefully examine the job description
- 2. Consider why you are interviewing
- 3. Perform research on the company and role

4. Consider your answers to common interview questions

Here are some questions that you may be asked in a Job interview



- Could you tell me something about yourself and describe your background in brief?
- How do you deal with pressure or stressful situations?
- What are your salary expectations?
- Why are you interested in our company?
- Why are you interested in this position?

- What are your strengths?
- What are your weaknesses?
- Why did you leave your last job?
- 5. Practice your speaking voice and body language
- 6. Prepare your travel arrangements
- 7. Present yourself accurately and positively
- 8. Have a question to ask the company. You are normally asked if you have any questions at the end of the interview. If your question has been answered, say all your questions have been covered during the interview this is fine to do.

It is normal to be asked when you would be available to start if you were offered the job. This does not mean that you are being offered it.
