The Prayer Diary - January to March 2023

The main part of this Prayer Diary covers the quarter from Christmas Day 25th December to Saturday 25th March, week by week, under the following headings:

- Anglican Biddings for each day taken from the Anglican Cycle of Prayer (adapted and updated where possible), so that we are praying with the Anglican Church round the world. A new version of the Cycle of Prayer began last year, spread over more than two years, and allowing us once again to pray for just one diocese each day.
- Hereford Again, a bidding for each day: each quarter these will feature half of our deaneries and parishes, along with diocesan organisations, areas of work, and officers.
- Porvoo This weekly bidding pairs the Lutheran churches of the Nordic and Baltic areas and the Anglican churches of the British Isles and of Spain and Portugal, which have signed the Porvoo Declaration recognising each others' ministries. Also included is the Latvian Church, which has not yet taken a decision on signing the Declaration, and the Church of Denmark, which has not signed but wishes to develop links with the churches which have signed.
- The Wider View Biddings and promptings for prayer relating to world mission and development, including our own World Church links, among them our companion links with the Kirchenkreis Nürnberg in Germany, and the Tanzanian dioceses of Tanga, Dar es Salaam, Masasi and Newala.
- This Week Focuses for prayer during the week, on themes and issues in healthcare, the community, education and the changing seasons, along with events, meetings, and activities within our Diocese and perhaps more widely.
- Today Events and activities from the Diocesan Diary please note that many of these are provisional, depending on what restrictions remain in place.
- > **Prayer** A prayer or reflection appropriate to the week.

Please send entries for the next edition which covers the quarter April to June 2023 to me at wkrowell@btinternet.com - clearly marked in the subject area as Prayer Diary. The more I know about events and activities, the more accurate and focused our prayer biddings can be. Pray for those who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, and for the organisations and charities which offer support and refuge. Pray also for refugees, including those who have found a home in our communities, many of whom will have left family and friends in places of danger, and will be worried for their safety. The feast of Stephen , first martyr of the Church, directs our thoughts and prayers toward the persecuted Church in today's world, and for all who are discriminated against or treated badly because of the faith they follow. Wednesday commemorates the Holy Innocents , and directs our thoughts towards children at risk or in danger, but also to those who misuse the power they hold, the places of tyranny and injustice, and the many vulnerable people in our world who are exploited and abused. Give thanks for the beauty of our countryside , even in the depths of winter, and pray for local events connected to the Ramblers' Festival of Winter Walks over this period. Pray for those who maintain and protect local footpaths and places of interest. Pray for all visi

The Wider View	Pray for our link with Nuremberg, and for those in leadership both here and there. At the time of preparing this diary there is cautious hope for progress in trade negotiations between the UK and the EU. As churches we also face many of the same issues, not least the way in which the struggles of the present time have exposed and enhanced existing weaknesses. And yet there is also opportunity, and the call to mission remains a priority.
This Week	As the New Year begins, many of us will more aware of challenge than of opportunity in what lies ahead. Divisions seem to be deepening within society and across the wider world, with a hardening of attitudes. Pray for all who are working for conciliation and peace, and those who speak out in support of those who are marginalised and discriminated against. The Christmas and New Year period is a particularly difficult time for those who suffer from addictions of various kinds, and therefore also for their families and friends. Pray for all who are caught in the grip of addictive behaviour, and for those who offer support, refuge, and a way out. Many of us in any case may drink more than we mean to over Christmas, and January is promoted as " Dry January " by Alcohol Concern. Pray for all aiming to reduce their alcohol intake, and also for the many of us who will use this month and our New Year's resolutions to improve our exercise routines and perhaps eat more sensibly. 4th January was the birthday of Louis Braille , and World Braille Day is kept on this day, focusing on those living with sight impairments, for many of whom the tactile Braille representation of numbers and letters is a lifeline. Braille continues to be of huge importance despite the assistance new technologies can provide - pray for all who live with sight loss, and give thanks for all that enables their participation in all aspects of community life. The Feast of the Epiphany begins a season of reflection on the ways in which Christ is revealed among us as our Light and Salvation, beginning with the gifts of the Magi and the good news that he is the Saviour of all. Give thanks for the worldwide mission of the Church today, and that the message of saving love crosses all kinds of human boundaries and speaks to every heart. Pray for all involved in the launch on Saturday of the Year of Prayer in our Diocese, with a Festival of Light in the Cathedral.

As the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins (on Wednesday), give thanks for the breadth of Christian worship, discipleship and fellowship that is seen in this various denominations and traditions of the Church. May we value what we see, and are attracted by or challenged by, looking to those whose traditions are different from our own, and recognising one another as fellow pilgrims. This year's theme focuses on racial justice. In the week that includes commemoration of Antony of Egypt , hermit, pray for all who are drawn to the eremitic life today. Give thanks for those whose disciplined and devoted prayer life as solitaries or within communities gives support and sustenance to the wider Church. Martin Luther King Day is kept on Monday in the United States. Pray for those who continue to strive for the freedom of others, at a time when in the US extremist and negative forces seem to be ever more strident.
