The Prayer Diary - January to March 2025

The main part of this Prayer Diary covers the quarter from Sunday 29th December to Saturday 29th March, week by week, under the following headings:

- ➤ Anglican Biddings for each day taken from the Anglican Cycle of Prayer (adapted and updated where possible), so that we are praying with the Anglican Church round the world. The new version of the Cycle of Prayer, spread over more than two years, allows us once again to pray for just one diocese each day.
- ➤ **Hereford** Again, a bidding for each day: each quarter these will feature half of our deaneries and parishes, along with diocesan organisations, areas of work, and officers.
- ➤ **Porvoo** This weekly bidding pairs the Lutheran churches of the Nordic and Baltic areas and the Anglican churches of the British Isles and of Spain and Portugal, which have signed the Porvoo Declaration recognising each others' ministries. Also included is the Latvian Church, which has not yet taken a decision on signing the Declaration, and the Church of Denmark, which has not signed but wishes to develop links with the churches which have signed.
- ➤ The Wider View Biddings and promptings for prayer relating to world mission and development, including our own World Church links, among them our companion links with the Kirchenkreis Nürnberg in Germany, and the Tanzanian dioceses of Tanga, Dar es Salaam, Masasi and Newala.
- ➤ This Week Focuses for prayer during the week, on themes and issues in healthcare, the community, education and the changing seasons, along with events, meetings, and activities within our Diocese and perhaps more widely.
- ➤ **Today** Events and activities from the Diocesan Diary please note that many of these are provisional, depending on what restrictions remain in place.
- > **Prayer** A prayer or reflection appropriate to the week.

In particular, political tensions between the mainland and Zanzibar often present along religious lines: Christians probably form a majority nationwide, but Islam is stronger in the coastal areas, and is practised by almost all Zanzibaris. Pray for good and peaceful relationships between all faiths, at a time when some more extremist voices are beginning to make themselves heard.

Give thanks for the distinctive contribution made by Quakers today, and pray for the Friends Meeting Houses active within our diocese. Pray for the new Severn Borders Deanery in our diocese as it is established, bringing together the churches and communities of the former Bridgnorth and Telford Severn Gorge deaneries. (Note: the parishes themselves will now be listed in the 2nd and 4th quarter Prayer Diaries). The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on the last day of this week: pray for our preparations for marking this week, for all that brings together the different churches that serve our communities, and for the ecumenical community in Bose, Italy, that has prepared this year's material. Plough Sunday was traditionally held at the beginning of January, but may be marked on other Sundays of January these days - pray for those places where Plough Sunday worship or events take place, and for all that helps promote awareness of the needs and concerns of the farming community, its place within our economy, and the responsibility we share to use the natural resources around us in a way that honours their Creator. Pray for retired clergy and others with permission to officiate , giving thanks for the support they provide to licensed ministers, especially in our more rural groups of churches. Pray for road safety at this dark time of the year when road surfaces may be icy or flooded, and for cyclists and pedestrians on our country lanes. Pray for all who represent our communities in the various echelons of government, those elected to Parliament and, in our Welsh parishes, to the Senedd, for County Councillors, and for the many who offer their services as Parish, Community (in Wales) or Town Councillors.

This Week	This Sunday is kept each year as World Religion Day, and aims to promote understanding and peace between all religions, encouraging people to learn about other faiths and their followers. Pray for good relationships between faith communities in our own nation, and for the places and situations in which religions become a cause of division and strife. Pray for special services and other events to mark the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This is the 1,700th anniversary of the Council of Nicea - pray that we may value and affirm our shared beliefs, as well as respecting and valuing the variety of expression of faith within our various traditions. Thank God for the new ecumenical initiatives developing in Germany following the Lutheran-Roman Catholic Agreement on Justification. Blue Monday is supposedly the most depressing day of the year. In fact, for some people this is a very stressful time of the year: pray for all who are struggling with mental health issues. Brew Monday is a response to this - a day sponsored by the Samaritans to encourage us to talk through the stresses and strains of living. Give thanks for the work of the Samaritans, and for all who are there to listen and perhaps offer refuge at difficult and desperate times. Monday is also Martin Luther King Day. As Donald Trump takes office as President (this is also Inauguration Day), pray that under his leadership the United States may continue to be a society in which all are valued and affirmed, and may actively promote peace and justice in the world. Pray for all who live with forms of dementia, and for families and carers, for those for whom severe dementia is seriously disabling, for specialist care where this is needed, for research into causes, ways of slowing the process of dementia, and affective therapies. Pray also for training and awareness to ensure that churches and community organisations are dementia-friendly. Saturday marks the Conversion of Paul: may we be aware of the ways in which we encounter in our own lives God's claim u

This Week	George Herbert is remembered this week, as an inspirational writer, several of whose poems remain sung as hymns, and as a faithful and thoughtful country parson. Pray for vocations to rural ministry today, and for Christian poets and hymn writers whose work enriches our faith and enables our worship. Pray for all who experience eating disorders of various kinds, particularly those for whom this is a real danger to their physical health. Pray for better understanding, and for those who are able to counsel and support. Pray for those places within our communities where new homes are being built, in both towns and villages: for those moving in, perhaps from other parts of the country, as they settle and integrate, for sufficient affordable homes to ensure young families can get onto the housing ladder, and for churches to rise to the challenge of making creative contact with new arrivals. Pray for all who are involved in amateur theatre, for local am-dram groups, for those who teach theatre skills in our schools and colleges, and also for those who arrange outings to the professional theatre. Saturday this week is Self Harm Awareness Day. This is the intentional act of harming or injuring our body, perhaps done at times of intense stress or unhappiness. Self-harm is not always obvious - it also includes such things as substance abuse, our relationship with eating (see above), or deliberately acting in a way that puts oneself in danger. Pray for better understanding of this difficult area of human activity and mental disorder, and for those who self harm to be able to access sources of advice, care and refuge. Saturday is also St David's Day: pray for the people and churches of Wales, for our sisters and brothers of the Church in Wales, and for the Welsh parishes and churches that fall within our own diocese. May we take to heart the saint's closing words to his brothers - 'Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do.'

The Wider View	Many African countries continue to rely heavily on foreign aid, but studies suggest that such aid may not only fail to reduce poverty and encourage growth - it may even act against these objectives. Africa is the only continent in which the inflow of aid substantially outstrips that of private capital, and many are now saying that reform is needed. The "free" money of aid can skew the economy, and the misallocation of resources, along with corruption and poor governance mean aid is often not used well. It has been argued that aid is ineffective in where there's bad governance, and unnecessary where governance is good. Official aid can create dependency, foster corruption, and often has minimal impact on the delivery of long-term growth. Pray for a move away from aid being seen as a source of regular income, and for action to promote private sector development and entrepreneurship. Pray also for a more effective model of foreign aid targeted to help build robust economic and democratic institutions.	
This Week	Tuesday is the Feast of the Annunciation : give thanks for the faithful obedience of Blessed Mary. Pray also for the work and witness of the Mothers' Union, and for the MU branches of our diocese. Pray for all in our world who suffer from tuberculosis , for immunisation campaigns, research and treatment. The annual Great British Spring Clean is now under way.
